Budget/Finance Committee Meeting Minutes with the Raymond School Board

2007-2008 SCHOOL BUDGET Monday, March 19, 2007

1. Call to order. Rolf Olsen called the meeting to order at 7:06 pm at the Broadcast Studio saying that they would not be voting on the school budget tonight but would wait until their next meeting on April 2, 2007.

2. Minutes: February 22, 2007

MOTION: Sue Accardi motioned to approve the Minutes of February 22, 2007 as written.

Seconded by Robert Gosselin.

VOTE: Unanimous 8-0

3. School Budget 2007-2008 Presentation.

Mrs. Caldwell, Superintendent, reviewed the budget noting areas of increases and decreases. The effect of the state's EPS guidelines had a direct bearing on the presentation of the written budget as well as the amounts allotted per cost center.

There was discussion regarding the tuition account and how the concept of a choice of schools might impact the budget in the future. Currently the costs are:

It was discussed that transportation might be reduced by coordinating the pick-up from several school districts. It was also noted that if pickup points could be clustered, leaving fewer stops for the buses, it might also reduce the budget. The estimate per pupil was \$929.

The discussion concerning special education focused on the expense of regular high school tuition and then an added cost per special education student. Currently there are 125 special education students in our K-8th grade, with 558 students total.

Mrs. Caldwell informed them that she didn't have the new EPS figures from the state. With her estimates the budget was \$300,000 over the EPS.
