a) Consideration of new members to the Beautification Committee - Fran Gagne and Elissa Gifford

Beautification Committee Chairperson Sharon Dodson is recommending Fran Gagne and Elissa Gifford for membership on the Beautification Committee. The Board of Selectmen need to set the dates of the Annual Town Meeting, to vote on proposed land use ordinance changes and establish referendum dates. Consideration should also be given to the form of these legislative meetings and votes where not otherwise prescribed by law as is the case in approving the School Budget.

c) Consideration and appointment of Mid-Maine Waste Corporation (MMWAC) alternate to the Board of Directors

Recently the MMWAC Board of Directors amended their by-laws to allow for the appointment of alternates for the Board of Directors. This change came about through a change in state law. The Town of Raymond is represented on the MMWAC Board of Directors by Selectman Dana Desjardins. In the past, I have attended in his place, as an alternate, but not been allowed to vote since it was then prohibited by state law. Selectmen are now being given an opportunity to appoint a voting alternate. This position could be assumed by another member of the Board of Selectmen, person at large, or if no one has interest in the position, I would be willing to continue to serve in that capacity.


d) School consolidation information update - Selectman Joe Bruno

The MMWAC Board of Directors recently amended our Bylaws to allow for the appointment of Alternates to the Board of Directors. A recent change in State law officially provided for the appointment of Alternates to organizations like MMWAC. Attached is a copy of the relevant change to our Bylaws.

I would encourage you to name such an Alternate so that your municipality can always be represented. Circumstances will arise from time-to-time when a Director is unable to attend. It will also facilitate the conduct of business at MMWAC by making quorums more achievable.

If you name an Alternate to our Board please advise us in writing and include contact information so we can keep the Alternate fully informed with minutes, agendas, reports and other information that is regularly distributed to the Board members.

AMENDMENT TO BY-LAWS Adopted 1/22/08

Amend Article IV, Section 7(a), as follows:

Six (6) Directors appointed by the Participating Municipalities in accordance with the procedure described in the Certificate of Organization shall constitute a quorum, except that for matters with respect to which approval by 85% of the voting interests is required, pursuant to Article IX and Section 7(c) hereof, 85% of the voting interests shall constitute a quorum. The Board of Directors shall consist of the number of directors equal to the number of Participating Municipalities under the Mid-Maine Waste Action Corporation Interlocal Solid Waste Agreement, as amended from time to time (the "Participating Municipalities"). The Municipal Officers of each Participating Municipality shall appoint the Director representing their Municipality, shall have the right to appoint an alternate Director to act as the Participating Municipality's representative on the Board of Directors in the absence of the Director appointed by the Municipal Officers, and shall have the sole right to remove the Director or alternate Director so appointed. The Municipal Officers of such Municipality may remove the director representing such Municipality at any time with or without cause. Each Director shall serve until such Director resigns or is removed.
