

Docks (This is only a summary)

- No more than one pier, dock, wharf or similar structure extending or located below the normal high-water line of a water body or within a wetland is allowed on a single lot; except that when a single lot contains at least twice the minimum shore frontage as specified.
- The location shall not interfere with existing developed or natural beach areas.
- The facility shall be no larger in dimension than necessary to carry on the activity and be consistent with the surrounding character of the area. A temporary pier, dock or wharf in non-tidal waters shall not be wider than six feet for noncommercial uses.
- All temporary structures must be removed to beyond the normal high water line by December first of each year, or a penalty of \$100.00 per day beyond December first shall be imposed.
- Permanent structures projecting into or over water bodies shall require a permit from the Department of Environmental Protection pursuant to the Natural Resource Protection Act, Title 38 M.R.S.A., Section 480-C.

NOTE: Replacement of any dock requires a permit from the Town of Raymond.
