Rob/Heidi- I need to conduct a site visit to 18 Fernwood Rd in Raymond in regards to the ongoing shoreline stabilization project. You received a PBR #72924 dated August 10, 2021. In the email below, you agreed to maintain a maximum of 100 linear feet of shorefront which is a required standard under PBR Section 8. Additionally, the riprap needs to remain no higher than 2 feet above normal high water line. As the pictures show, this work appears to disregard both these required standards, and therefore would not qualify for PBR. The work would have required a full Natural Resources Protection Act (NRPA) individual permit. I am contacting the Town and asking them to assist me for this site visit. I strongly suggest stopping the remaining work (but getting the appropriate ESC controls in place ASAP to avoid any further water quality violations) and allowing the appropriate agencies to meet onsite to discuss the next steps. Minimally this work will need to be cut down to what PBR standards require and areas that have been disturbed will need to be restored.

Additionally, I noticed a second home has been constructed in the last few years. I believe that should have gotten a Stormwater PBR because this property is well over the one acre threshold of impervious area and no longer meets the single-family residence exemption. I will be speaking with my supervisor to discuss if an ATF stormwater permit will be required. The large amount of riprap that has been placed at the shorefront greatly increases that impervious area number as well.

I will reach back out after connecting with all agencies and folks,

In order to qualify, you will need to change the plans to reflect no more than 100 linear feet of shorefront being stabilized. Once that portion is complete, another PBR can be submitted for the remaining shorefront. If you want to complete the activity as one project, it will require a full individual NRPA permit. Please email Dawn Hallowell for a preapplication meeting and/or to assign a project manager.
