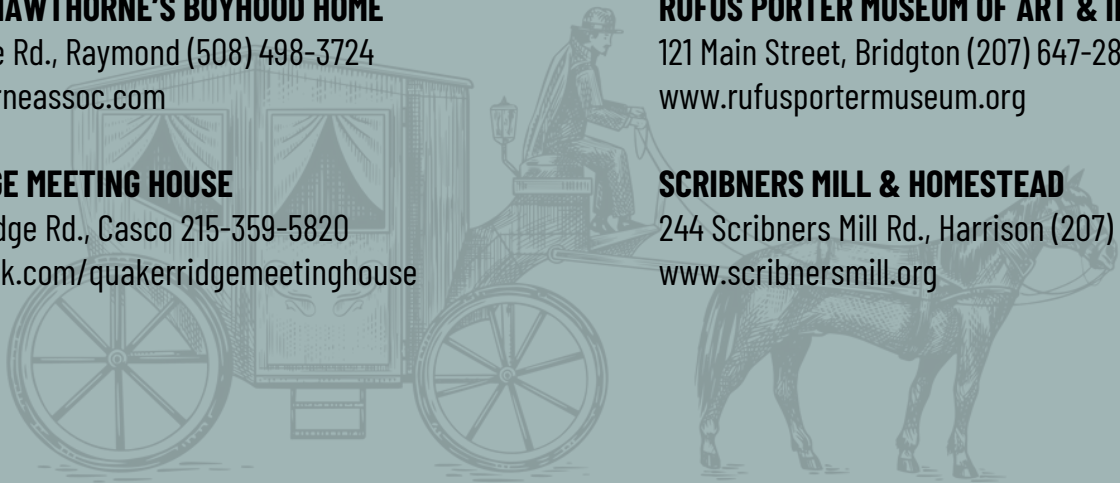

Parking: Westbrook Community Center – Front and side parking.

Accessibility: Wheelchair accessible.

Restrooms: Yes, multiple.

Mission: The Westbrook Maine Historical Society is dedicated to bringing together individuals who share an interest in our city's rich history by discovering, collecting and preserving artifacts and materials that reflect Westbrook's heritage.

Windham Historical Society

Parking: Gravel parking lot between the main brick building & RSU 14 building. Street parking is allowed.

Accessibility: 4 of 6 buildings are wheelchair accessible.

Restrooms: Not at this time, main building is under renovation.

Mission: The goal of the Windham Historical Society is to foster interest in the history of the town by presenting relevant programs, providing educational opportunities, and maintaining historical facilities where displays of the town's past are available.



Nathaniel Hawthorne's Boyhood Home

40 Hawthorne Rd., Raymond

Parking: There is a small gravel parking lot on the south side. Street parking.

Accessibility: Not wheelchair accessible. 2 ½ steps.

Restrooms: Yes. One restroom.

Mission: Dedicated to perpetuating the memory of Nathaniel Hawthorne and preserving his boyhood home, honoring the memory of the early settlers who worshipped in that building, and fostering friendly relations among the community's residents and seasonal visitors.

Quaker Ridge Meeting House

141 Quaker Ridge Rd., Casco

Parking: Along the road unless there's a funeral next door. Then parking gently on the grass below the meeting house.

Accessibility: Not accessible to a wheelchair. Two steps.

Restrooms: Facilities are available at Hacker's Hill.

A Guide will be available from 10-2:30.

Otherwise walk in and look around.

History: House was built in 1814 and is the oldest Quaker meeting house in Maine still in use today. While plain on the outside, the interior design has a story to tell.





Raymond-Casco Historical Society

Parking: Gravel parking lot.

Accessibility: Buildings are wheelchair accessible but not the Schoolhouse.

Rest rooms: Yes.

Mission: The purpose of the Society shall be to collect, preserve and interpret materials which document the history of Raymond & Casco.

Collections: Campus includes the 19th century Watkins Blacksmith Shop, a One Room Schoolhouse, Antique Automobile Collection, 19th century Barn, and newly renovated Museum with an extensive collection.

Naples Historical Society & Museum

Parking: Parking is available in the Village Green area or on Rt 302.

Accessibility: No steps to enter building. Most areas are wheelchair accessible.

Rest rooms: Yes. One rest room.

Mission: To further inform the citizenry of Naples and others of the heritage and traditions of the town and to collect, preserve and display Naples-related items that all may share in the history of Naples. Visitors will receive a map and info about historic Edes Falls.

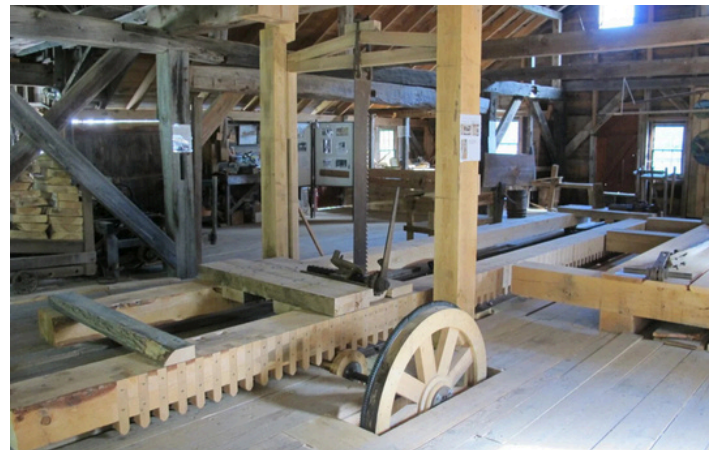
Parking: Park in the mill pond space across from the mill; also park along the road.

Accessibility: Not wheelchair accessible.

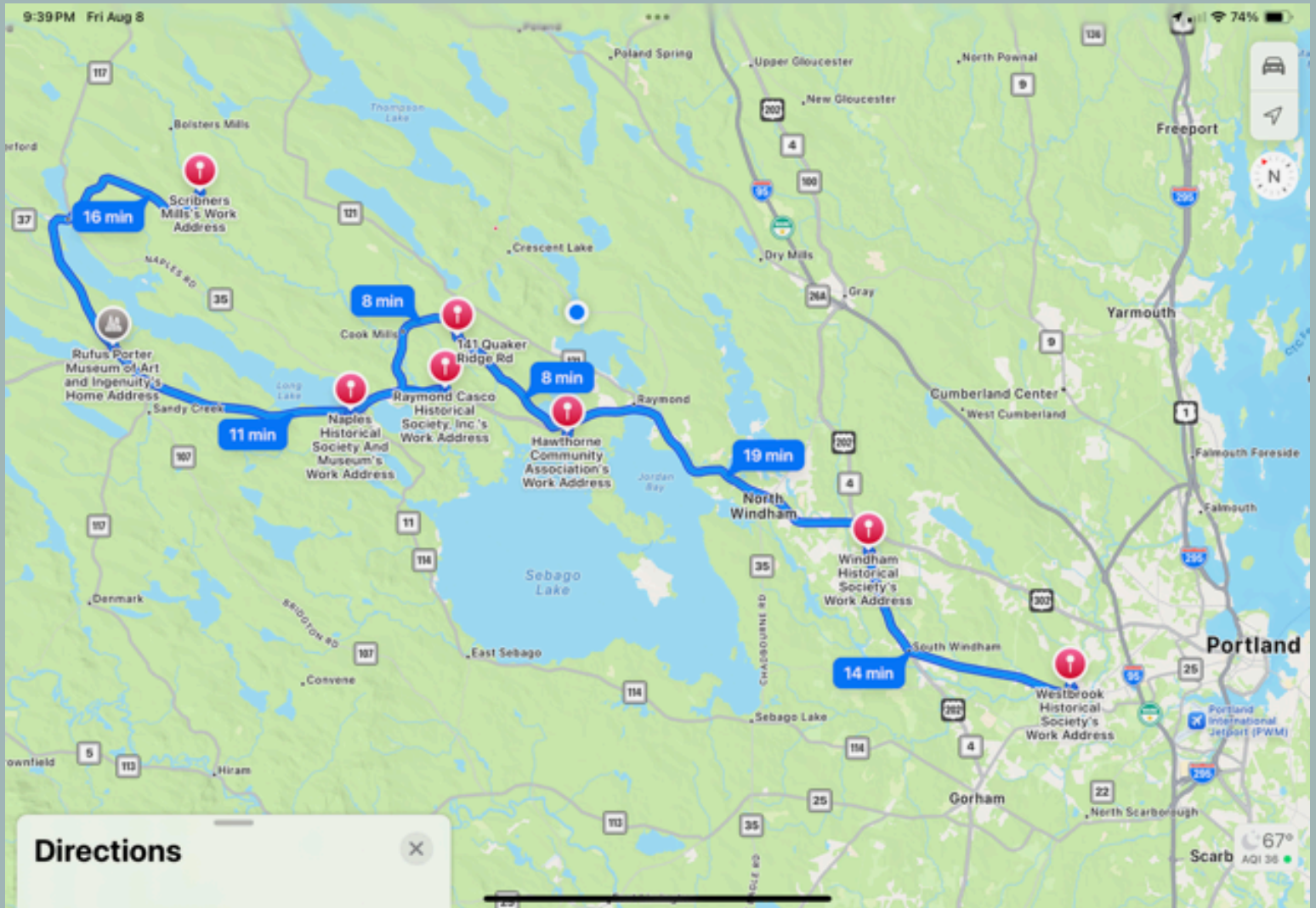
Restrooms: One rest room in the homestead.

Mission: Preserve and restore the 1847 Scribner family sawmill and homestead, continuously operated from 1847 to 1962 by the Scribner family.
