## Nature's speed bumps on Gore Road no more!

"Hallelujah, finally" stated the school bus driver from MSAD # 15 Gray/New Gloucester as she drove down Gore Rd on her afternoon route. For many years the private section of Gore Rd in Raymond connecting to the Gray town line has been in disrepair. The section of road was well on its way to becoming nearly impassable. However, with some ingenuity, interlocal cooperation and financial contributions from the residents of both towns, a solution was found.

The Town of Raymond assumed ownership of that section after approval by the citizens of Raymond at the June 4, 2019 Annual Town Meeting. Raymond Public Works crew completed the ditching work and improving the drainage via new culverts. Base paving was completed on October 2nd. "It's been a long time coming. I am glad we could get it done and I am pretty pleased with how it came out," stated Public Works Director, Nathan White. The final surface pavement will be placed in the Spring of 2020, ending the long-standing problem of this failing road.

Question 1 - Bond Issue: "Do you favor a \$105,000,000 bond issue to build or improve roads, bridges, railroads, airports, transit and ports and make other transportation investments, to be used to match an estimated \$137,000,000 in federal and other funds?"

Question 2 - Constitutional Amendment: "Do you favor amending the Constitution of Maine to allow persons with disabilities to sign petitions in an alternative manner as authorized by the Legislature?"
