EXEMPLIONS

MRSA Title 36: In determining the local assessed value of the exemption, the assessor's shall multiply the amount of the exemption by the ratio of current just value upon which the assessment is based as furnished in the assessor's annual return to the State Tax Assessor.

For the 2021-2022 assessment, the Town of Raymond certified the maximum ratio available of 92% to the State of Maine. Therefore, all exemptions noted above have been adjusted by 8% to the amounts shown on your tax bill to comply with State Law. The adjusted amounts are as follows:

Homestead: \$23,000 • Veterans: \$5,520 Blind: \$3,680 • Parsonage: \$18,400
