Public Safety Electric Vehicle Training

Raymond Fire and Rescue held Electric Vehicle Training on November 9. The goal of this training was to review how to identify an electric vehicle, the unique issues that arise when an EV is involved in a crash or fire, and resources to help identify the actions necessary to mitigate hazards, facilitate rescues, and provide safety to responders and the environment.



A 40 Minute PPT presentation and review of reference guides from NFPA concluded with a 40-minute review of the town's electric vehicle the Chevy Bolt. The Bolt was raised on blocks so the battery area could be reviewed. Students identified electrical disconnects, which wires were safe to cut for power if needed, and reviewed the safety features like airbag systems, and procedures for responding to incidents involving EV's.

The town acquired the Chevy Bolt in 2020 with the assistance of a grant through Efficiency Maine.

- Recycle newspapers, wrapping paper, envelopes, birthday cards and phone books. All sorts of cardboard can be recycled, too, even toilet and paper towel tubes.
- Keep the recycling container next to the trash can and remind everyone to recycle as much as possible.
- What to recycle: plastic and glass bottles, cans, white and colored paper, magazines, junk mail and catalogs!
- Please NO food waste, Styrofoam, food wrappers, plant material or hazardous waste.



CONTESTANTS:

Score sheets must be submitted by noon on Monday Dec. 5th and winners will be announced Friday, Dec. 9th.
