STATE OF MAINE PROPERTY TAX STABILIZATION PROGRAM



Property Tax Stabilization for Senior Citizens is a state program that allows certain senior-citizen residents to stabilize, or freeze, the property taxes on their homestead.

WHO QUALIFIES?

To be eligible for the Program, an individual must meet all the following as of April 1 of the property tax year for which they are requesting stabilization (so for applications due December 1, 2022, qualifications must be met as of April 1, 2023);

1) at least 65 years old,
2) a permanent resident of Maine,
3) have owned a Maine homestead for at least ten years, and
4) be eligible for a homestead exemption on the property they are placing in the Program.

KEY THINGS TO REMEMBER:

REY LITHUSS TO REMINIBER:

**Fill your application by December 1, each year for consideration of the next years taxes. (File by December 1, 2022, for stabilization of the 2023-2024 taxes) This deadline is not currently evidendable by the local assessor.

**File your application with the Assessor's Office at Town Hall in the municipality where you reside

This Program requires annual application (unlike the homestead exemp-

tion which carries over from year to year)

• The Assessor's office will begin review of received applications after the
