BACK TO SCHOOL INFORMATION AND SAFETY TIPS

The 2023 Summer season has flown by. It felt like Spring finally arrived and then it quickly went March, April, Mayjunejuly to AUGUST! While there is still plenty of warm weather and sunshine to be found, it's also time to think about sending the kids back to school. Raymond schools start the 23-24 school year on Tuesday August 29th. This will mean school buses, slowed commute times, and young drivers and pedestrians on the roads. Going back to school always brings traffic congestion with kids trying to get to school before the bell rings and harried parents trying to get to work. Be aware and alert when you are traveling in school zones. Check out the below safety tips to prepare yourselves for the upcoming school year.

- SLOW DOWN school zones have a 15mph speed limit
- STAY ALERT distracted driving is never ok and especially important around kids
- Familiarize yourself with the school's drop-off and pick-up procedures
- Don't double park during drop off or load/unload children across the street from the school
- Never pass a bus from either direction if it is stopped to load or unload childrenIf the "stop arm" is out on a bus and yellow or red lights are
- flashing, traffic MUST stop

 Children can be unpredictable, stop far enough back to give
- them plenty of spaceAlways stop for a crossing guard or school patrol officer
- directing traffic
- Do not block a crosswalk with your vehicle
- Teach your kids bus stop safety how to stand back on the curb and how to cross 10 feet in front of the bus so the driver can see them.
- If your child is walking or riding a bike to school review your family's safety rules. Make sure they know the route, how to safely cross a street, and how to ride or walk with traffic
- Practice driving in congested areas with new teen drivers
- Set good examples for your kids
- ALWAYS follow school zone speed limits
