HOME HEATING ASSISTANCE FUNDS

The Town of Raymond, through monies from Cumberland County, is accepting heating assistance applications from low to moderate income families for heating expenses this winter.

The program covers heating costs from Jan 27 to April 15, 2023 & is on a first come basis until the monies are depleted. FUEL TYPES INCLUDE OIL, WOOD PELLETS, PROPANE, ELECTRICAL HEAT, KEROSENE, AND WOOD.

Renters are eligible if the rental agreement does not cover heating expenses. The application to apply is on the Town's website or can be picked up at the Town Hall. Residents must meet the income guidelines listed on the application. FMI email: cathy.gosselin@raymondmaine.org.

PROPERTY TAX **EXEMPTIONS**

Did you know the State of Maine provides property tax relief through different programs to qualified individuals? Below is a list of property tax exemptions that may qualify you for a discount off your total assessed tax value. For more information or for an exemption application, please visit: raymondmaine.org/content/property-tax-exemptions.

ALL APPLICATIONS DUE BY APRIL 1, 2023

Homestead Exemption

This program provides a measure of property tax relief for certain individuals that have owned homestead property in Maine for at least 12 months and make the property they occupy on April 1 their permanent residence.

Veteran's Exemption

A veteran who served during a recognized war period and is 62 years or older; or, is receiving 100% disability as a Veteran; or became 100% disabled while serving, is eligible for a tax exemption. Veteran must be listed as a co-owner on the deed.

Blind Exemption

An individual who is determined to be legally blind may receive a tax exemption. Individual must be listed as a co-owner on the deed.

*Exemption amounts will vary year to year based on the towns certified ratio.
