Raymond residents are welcome to get small amounts of sand/salt for use on walkways and driveways.

Please respect the limit of two 5-gallons buckets at a time.

The Sand and Salt Shed is located on Plains Rd (FL 89)

& the gates are open from 7am-3pm, Monday-Friday.

All other areas & equipment remain off limits to the public. NOTE: The shed is closed during snowstorms for safety and to allow the plow truck traffic to move freely.

Recycling At Home- Zero Sort makes it easy!

 Use a tote and place your recycling out with your trash to be picked up.

Here are some simple tips to recycle more effectively:

- Flatten down cardboard boxes
- Rinse out plastic, glass bottles and cans
- Recycle newspapers, wrapping paper, envelopes, birthday cards and phone books. All sorts of cardboard can be recycled, too, even toilet and paper towel tubes.
- Keep the recycling container next to the trash can and remind everyone to recycle as much as possible.
- What to recycle: plastic and glass bottles, cans, white and colored paper, magazines, junk mail and catalogs!
- Please NO food waste, Styrofoam, food wrappers, plant material or hazardous waste.

State of Maine
Property Tax
Stabilization Program
for Senior Citizens

REPEALED

The Property Tax Stabilization for Senior Citizens Program allowed certain senior-citizen residents to stabilize, or freeze, the property taxes on their homestead was repealed by the Maine State Legislature.

A letter to all seniors who qualified last year was mailed this week letting them know the program is no longer viable and directs them to Maine Revenue Services to explore two existing State programs benefiting low-income seniors.

Senior Bridge Group


Every Tuesday 9am-Noon


