Remembrance Ceremony for the British Naval Pilots

May 17, 2024 at 11:30 a.m. at the Veterans Memorial Park on Route 302 in Raymond

The Town of Raymond and the British & Commonwealth Remembrance Project request the honor of your presence at a dedication ceremony to remember the service and sacrifice made by 2 Royal Navy pilots who perished in Sebago Lake when they crashed during a WWII training exercise on May 18, 1944.

Four planes were flying that day in formation from Brunswick Naval Air Station where Royal Navy Aircrew were training with American pilots for combat. While practicing emergency landing procedures over Sebago Lake, two of the aircraft collided. Both pilots, Sub Lt Vaughn Reginald Gill and Sub Lt Raymond L Knott, perished. The site was declared a war grave in 2003 by the State of Maine and the British Government.

Vermiculturist Jock Robie will supply all the equipment needed to start 5 worm bins at no charge. A lottery will be held to see who gets to take them home (1 per household).
